**West Virginia Social Studies (Geography and History) CSO's**

The following CSO's may be met with students' participation in this workshop.

**Kindergarten**                      Students will:

<b>SS.S.G.04</b>	examine the physical and human characteristics of place and explain how the lives of people are rooted in places and regions.
<b>SS.O.K.04.01</b>	locate...land masses using a globe or a map.
<b>SS.O.K.04.04</b>	compare and contrast the characteristics of weather and human adaptation: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• types of weather</li> <li>• types of clothing</li> </ul>
<b>SS.S.K.05</b>	use the processes and resources of historical inquiry to develop appropriate questions, gather and examine evidence, compare, analyze and interpret historical data.
<b>SS.S.K.05</b>	examine, analyze and synthesize historical knowledge of major events, individuals, cultures and the humanities in West Virginia...and the world.
<b>SS.O.K.05.03</b>	research the past through stories of people...pictures...customs, traditions and legends and explain the differences in other people, time and cultures.

**First Grade**                              Students will:

<b>SS.S.01.04</b>	examine the physical and human characteristics of place and explain how the lives of people are rooted in places and regions.
<b>SS.O.01.04.05</b>	recognize and relate how climate/weather affects the way people live (e.g., food, clothing, shelter, recreation).
<b>SS.S.01.05</b>	examine, analyze and synthesize historical knowledge of major events, individuals, cultures and the humanities in West Virginia...and the world.
<b>SS.O.01.05.03</b>	identify characteristics of the past...using sources such as stories...legends...and customs, and organize historical data.

**Second Grade**                              Students will:

<b>SS.S.02.04</b>	examine the physical and human characteristics of place and explain how the lives of people are rooted in places and regions.
<b>SS.O.02.04.03</b>	recognize major geographic features on a variety of maps and globes (e.g., rivers, lakes, oceans, islands, continents, mountains).
<b>SS.S.02.05</b>	examine, analyze and synthesize historical knowledge of major events, individuals, cultures and the humanities in West Virginia...and the world.

**Third Grade**

Students will:

<b>SS.S.03.04</b>	examine the physical and human characteristics of place and explain how the lives of people are rooted in places and regions.
<b>SS.O.03.04.03</b>	recognize world geographic features (e.g. ...continents...rivers, deserts...).
<b>SS.O.03.04.05</b>	compare and contrast climate, weather and location with regard to people's clothing, food, shelter and jobs.
<b>SS.O.03.04.06</b>	relate how people...are affected by the various elements of the environment (e.g., water...weather, climate, topography)
<b>SS.S.03.05</b>	examine, analyze and synthesize historical knowledge of major events, individuals, cultures and the humanities in West Virginia...and the world
<b>SS.O.03.05.03</b>	compare and contrast present cultures to the cultures of people of other historical time periods (e.g., source of food, clothing, shelter, products used).
<b>SS.O.03.05.04</b>	make historical inferences by analyzing artifacts and pictures.

**Fourth Grade**

Students will:

<b>SS.O.04.04.02</b>	analyze and assess the effects of and explain how people adapted to geographic factors (e.g., climate...bodies of water) on the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• transportation routes</li> <li>• settlement patterns and population density</li> <li>• culture (e.g., jobs, food, clothing, shelter, religion, government)</li> <li>• interactions with others (local, national, global)</li> </ul>
<b>SS.S.04.05</b>	examine, analyze and synthesize historical knowledge of major events, individuals, cultures and the humanities in West Virginia...and the world.

**Fifth Grade**

Students will:

<b>SS.S.05.04</b>	examine the physical and human characteristics of place and explain how the lives of people are rooted in places and regions.
<b>SS.S.05.05</b>	examine, analyze and synthesize historical knowledge of major events, individuals, cultures and the humanities in West Virginia...and the world.

**Sixth Grade**

Students will:

<b>SS.S.06.04</b>	examine the physical and human characteristics of place and explain how the lives of people are rooted in places and regions.
<b>SS.O.06.04.03</b>	locate and identify the continents, major climates, major bodies of water, natural resources and landforms and analyze the relationship of people with their environment regarding population demographics, settlement and trade.
<b>SS.O.06.04.05</b>	evaluate the effects of physical geography...on transportation, culture, economic activities and population density/distribution.
<b>SS.S.06.05</b>	examine, analyze and synthesize historical knowledge of major events, individuals, cultures and the humanities in West Virginia...and the world.

**Seventh Grade**
